However, research into the importance of processes such as home visits and a part time start highlights just how necessary it is to get this first transition right. It will set you child up for positive transitions throughout school and into adult life.

School Development Planning:

The school has undergone some big changes in the last few years and we have completed many of the key objectives on our School Development Plan. Since 2015 we have:

- **Improved outcomes for children in mathematics so that more children achieve or surpass the expected level.**
- **Improved outcomes for children in writing so that more children achieve or surpass the expected level (and achieve greater depth).**
- **Developed the outdoor area to enhance pupils' play and outdoor learning experience.**
- **Improved site security to further ensure pupils' safety and wellbeing.**
- **Maximised the impact of the pupil premium through timely and effective intervention.**
- **Secured the sustainable future of this village school.**

We are also very pleased to announce that Mrs Lagar has been appointed as lead practitioner in the nursery; a well-deserved promotion – congratulations.

Forest School:

Please note the Forest School dates in the adjacent column. Forest School is an integral part of our curriculum at Shere and we are incredibly lucky to have use of private forest land around Shere Manor House. Miss Bailey and Mrs Parker are Level 3 Qualified Forest School Instructors and each of them plans and delivers Forest School Sessions for our children. Children should come to school in their kit on Forest School days. Please ensure they are wearing long sleeved tee shirts, long trousers and sturdy footwear. As the weather gets colder please send them in layers and a warm, waterproof coat.

In order for Forest School sessions to run as effectively as possible, we rely on the help of volunteers. In the past parents, grandparents and friends have been wonderful helpers and have had a great time too!
